

Option Two: Fully Funded

This option is available term time only and does not carry any Additional Services and Facilities charges. Your child is able to attend our setting cost free, accessing high quality childcare offered by the nursery and includes all other costs associated with the delivery of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Below is the breakdown of how Jubilee Day Nursery delivers the 15 or 30 hours Free Entitlement:

15 hours
1 x 10 hour Full Day (8.00am-6.00pm)
1 x 5 hour AM session or 3 x 5 hour AM sessions (8.00am-1.00pm)

30 hours
3 x 10 hour Full Days (8.00am-6.00pm)
5 x 6 hour AM sessions (8.00am-2.00pm)

Should you require more childcare than the 15 or 30 hours funding can deliver, below outlines how you are able to add additional hours to your Fully Funded sessions, enabling you to make the most of this option. The cost is at a reduced rate (comparable to our standard rate) this enables you to continue to receive the same level of service year round. Sessions must be agreed termly.

Upgrade from a 15 hour AM sessions to a 10-hour session:
1.00pm- 6.00pm - £35.00

Upgrade from a 30 hour AM session to a 10-hour session:
2.00pm – 6.00pm - £28.00

Add additional sessions during the term time or during school holidays:

Please note that these prices do not include our Enriched and Enhanced Provision as they do not carry our Additional Services and Facilities charge.

5 hour AM 8.00am-1.00pm - £35.00

6 hour AM 8.00am-2.00pm - £42.00

10 hours 8.00am-6.00pm - £70.00

Providing food for your child

Children accessing our Fully Funded sessions will need to be provided with packed lunch, tea and snacks where appropriate, agreeing and adhering to our Parent Packed Meals policy.

Jubilee does offer the option to add all meals and snacks, this is charged at £12.00 for a Full Day session and £8.90 for an AM session, meaning that you would not need to bring packed food in daily.

This cost does not cover access to any of our other Enriched and Enhanced Provisions.

Holiday / Closures

We are closed on Bank Holidays and for the days between Christmas and New Year.

Late collection fee

If you are more than 15 minutes late for your allocated session pick up time, a late fee of £15 will be applied for the first hour.

Additionally, every hour entered in to following this will be charged at £15.00.

Children collected between 6.00pm and 6.15pm will incur a late fee of £15 and £10 for each 15 mins thereafter.

Additional hours

Additional hours that are booked outside of the Free Entitlement carry all of the standard Terms and Conditions for paid nursery hours.

Should you require any additional hours during the term time or need childcare during the school holidays we require these to be booked a term in advance, they are also non-changeable and non-cancellable once booked.

Parent packed meals and snacks



Jubilee Day Nursery's Enriched and Enhanced Provision sessions include the cost of all nursery meals and snacks.

If you opt for our Fully Funded sessions and do not wish to pay for nursery meals, you will need to provide your child with their own meals and snacks for the day. (nursery milk is still provided to drink with snack).

To maintain healthy development and growth children need to eat a nutritionally well-balanced diet. As an Early Years setting, we are in a strong position to influence and can contribute significantly to ensuring the health and well-being of your child. Good nutrition in early childhood can help to prevent a variety of health problems, both in the short term and later in life. There is an increasing concern that many children are consuming too much fat, sugar and salt and too little fibre, fruit and vegetables.

Our aim is to share information with parents around the importance of healthy packed meals and the balance of food groups whilst ensuring that all food brought from home that is consumed at nursery provide children with healthy and nutritious food.

As indicated on our Nursery Food page, your child requires a balanced diet that includes daily intake of all food groups.

-  Carbohydrates - Bread, Rice, Potatoes, Pasta - these starchy foods are a healthy source of energy. Packed meals should include carbohydrates.
-  Fruit and vegetables - these foods provide vitamins, minerals and fibre. Packed meals should include at least 1 portion of fruit and 1 portion of vegetables.
-  Protein - Meat, Fish, Eggs, Beans, Pulses - these foods provide protein for growth. Packed meals should include 1 portion of these foods
-  Dairy products that are low in sugar - these foods provide calcium for healthy bones and teeth. Include 1 portion daily.
-  Try to avoid excess salt and excess saturated fat.

Guidelines recommend it is important not to fill up on too many foods that are high in fat and/or sugar at the expense of other more nutritious foods. Limiting high fat and sugary foods will help protect your child from becoming overweight as well as helping prevent tooth decay, heart disease, stroke, and diabetes.



Responsibility of parents/carers when supplying own meals and snacks

To work with the setting to ensure that packed meals and snacks provide healthy options for your children.

- No nuts or nut-based products and potentially other allergens depending on the needs of other children in your child's room (of which you will be informed), to ensure other children are not exposed to potential life-threatening allergens.
- Appropriately prepared food items, round food items to be cut into quarters, i.e., grapes, cherry tomatoes and blueberries. All stoned fruit to be prepared with stones/pits removed, i.e. cherries and plums, to reduce the risks of choking to your child or any other child.
- To supply appropriate packed meals and snacks in a container where food items can be stored correctly and securely.
- As fridge space is not available parents are advised to bring packed meals in insulated bags with freezer blocks, especially during the warmer months.
- Using reusable containers, rather than single use plastic containers.
- As there is no availability to warm food, all food must arrive at nursery ready to be eaten.



Your child's packed lunch must also not contain the following:

No drinks.
At Jubilee Daycare children are offered only water or milk during the nursery day both of which are supplied.



Chocolate /
Chocolate-coated products / sweets /

Do not regularly include items that are high in saturated fat or salt. For example: cooked sausages, sausage rolls, chipolatas, corned meat, individual meat pies.

Responsibility of Jubilee Day Nursery

To promote healthy eating, nursery staff will regularly monitor the content of packed meals and snacks.

Parents and carers who do not adhere to the packed meals and snacks policy will receive a leaflet in their child's bag reminding them of the policy. If a child is regularly sent in with packed meals and snacks that do not conform to this policy, the nursery will contact the parents and carers to discuss this.

- To provide a dining environment that is appropriate, hygienic and sociable with a seat and place to eat
- To provide fresh drinking water throughout the day and milk or milk alternative at AM snack

Waste and disposal

Nursery will within reason, send any uneaten packed lunch food items back home. The rationale for this is that parents can also monitor what their child has consumed during the day and then raise any concerns over their child's food intake within nursery.
